Friesian Horse Inspection day & test IBOP with Dutch KFPS jury 2019 - Regulations and Application form 27 July 2019

Article 1. Organizer

Associazione Friesian Horse Italia (hereinafter AFHI) is the solely branch studbook appointed by the KFPS (*Koninklijke Vereninging "Het Friesch Paarden-Stamboek"*) and by the Italian Ministry of Agriculture as Italian studbook of the Friesian Horse in Italy, entitled to organize a Friesian Horse Inspection day & Ibop test with KFPS jury, sent on purpose from The Netherlands. Inspection results are valid to register the horse in the KFPS studbook and update horse pedigrees.

Article 2. Participation Requirements and application deadline

The event is open to all Frisian horses, registered in Italy and abroad, with a regular KFPS document/pedigree:

- yellow/green (before 2015) or white/light blue (from 2015), attesting registration in the main studbook
- pink or blue (before 2015) or white/black (after 2015), attesting the registration in the BIJBOEK I and BIJBOEK II subsidiary studbooks
- in case of absence/loss of the KFPS documents, any Frisians horse can still be admitted to the inspection, following microchip check. Contact with the AFHI must be established before the event, in order to request microchip check in the KFPS data base. If present, a duplicate correct passport and pedigree will be issued after the event, upon payment of relevant fees and invoice

Registration opens on 25/03/2019 and closes on 15/06/2019. Regulations and Application form can be downloaded from the AFHI website (www.friesian.it, section *Modulistica*).

Requirements for horse owner:

- the horse pedigree and passport must be on the name of actual owner (if necessary, transfer of property can be updated after the event, upon settlement of relative fees and invoice)
- AFHI/KFPS membership for the current year (if necessary, this can be updated after the event, upon settlement of relative fees and invoice)
- settlement of the entire registration fee within the established deadline (15 June 2019)
- submission of all required documents, listed in point 7, by the specified deadline (15 June 2019)

If case of cancellation of the event, due to failure to reach the minimum number of 20 horses, the entire amount will be refunded by bank transfer. In the event of withdrawal or non-participation, the fee will be returned only and exclusively in the event of death of the horse, duly documented.

Article 3. Inspection description (the event will be held also in case of rain) 3.1 Identification of horses

Horses will be identified by microchip reading by means of suitable microchip reader. In the event of a mismatch between the read microchip no. and the one specified on the horse passport/pedigree, the horse will not be allowed to be inspected and registration fee will not be returned. It is therefore requested to submit a veterinary statement, on the doctor's stationary, with the microchip no. detected or, in alternative, a declaration of the owner (see application form at the end of the present document) that the specific microchip no. Was checked and confirmed. In case of mismatch, please contact AFHI as soon as possible, requesting to verify whether the detected microchip no.

exists in the KFPS data base in order to still be able to participate in the inspection. Correct passport and paper will be updated following the inspection day and upon settlement of relative fee and invoice.

Microchips are usually checked in the morning, before the event starts or before entering the field for preinspection. The jury will confirm time and place. All owners must keep ready and bring their horse/s with no delay. Failure to do so, will determine exclusion from the inspection (no reimbursement applicable).

3.2 Grooming

Hair around eyes, nose and muzzle should not be cut. Nose and muzzle hair can be shortened (leaving a min of 2 cm in length), but not burned, as the horse uses them to search for food and to inspect surroundings. It is acceptable (and advisable) to shave long hairs under jaws and throat, to enhance the horse head features.

It is not allowed to completely remove the hair inside the ears, as they shield the external ear from rainwater, dust, insects and parasites. It is however possible to cut the protruding hair, slightly bending the edge of the ears, eliminating the part that comes out and leaving the internal protective hair intact.

It is advisable, especially for horses with a lot of hair on the fetlock, to shave pastorals and leave the hair on the fetlock. This allows to highlight and enhance the movement of the horse, otherwise hidden by the hair. It is preferable not to completely shave the fetlock, unless strictly necessary (for example, in case of fissures or wounds).

It is advisable to trim the tail, if too long, to prevent the horse from stepping on it while moving backwards. Take as reference the joint of the fetlock. Tail and/or mane extensions are not allowed. It is preferable, but not mandatory, to cut the mane for about 2 cm on the pole of the neck to leave space for the halter. The mane must be completely loose.

White hair must not be coloured, failure to respect this rule will determine the exclusion of the horse from inspection (no reimbursement applicable). For any white spot caused by trauma/accidents/surgery, it is recommended to submit a veterinary statement explaining the origin of white hair/spots. Only a 3-cm star above the eye line is accepted for admission to the studbook.

Use of oil, grease or hoof spray is allowed.

3.3 Horse tack

Horses up to 2 years of age can be presented with a halter or bridle and simple bit. Horse from 3 years should be presented with bridle and simple bit. Special mouth pieces are not allowed. For stallions, bridle, bit and lead lien with chain is permitted. The foals presented with their mare, must wear a halter. Colour and material of the halter are at the discretion of the owner, traditionally white is preferred, but it is not mandatory.

3.4 Shoeing

Owners can decide whether to present their horse/s from 2 years with or without shoeing. Horses younger than 2 years, must be barefoot. Barefoot horses must have trimmed and cared for hooves. Only standard thickness shoes are allowed (maximum thickness 8 mm and maximum width 25 mm). Special, corrective shoeing with soles, thicknesses or other are not allowed. Small anti-slip grips added to the shoeing are allowed only on grass fields. The jury will take into account the measurement of any anti-slip grip added to the shoeing, by subtracting 1 cm from the measured height of the horse. The jury has the right to exclude from inspection or to declare the results invalid for horses presented with irregular shoeing.

3.5 Horse health

The jury can refuse to inspect any horse it shall consider in bad or compromised health conditions. This also applies to the mares presented together with the foal, even if they are not registered for the inspection, but only enter the ring for the foal inspection.

3.6 Pre- inspection

Starting from 2014, a pre-inspection of horses has been added before the actual inspection. The pre-inspection ring will have a minimum size of 20x20m and will be adjacent to the inspection field. Horses can be presented by owners or runners, strictly dressed in white. The organization will provide expert runners for the presentation, whose service can be booked and paid separately to the secretary of the AFHI on the same day of the event (see article 7 for fees). The horses will be viewed by the jury in small groups (maximum 6-7 horses), according to the order assigned and reported in the catalogue that each owner will receive before the event. For each category, the horses must be promptly presented to the pre-selection ring, it will therefore be the owner's responsibility to bring their own horses close to the place of pre-inspection on time, failure to do so may result in exclusion of the horse from inspection (without reimbursement of registration fees). At the beginning of each category, horses will be walked for two rounds of the field, then they will be assessed one by one, following the order of the catalogue, while other horses will be waiting at the edge of the ring (wide enough to allow to walk the horses by hand). Once the pre-inspection of each horse is over, the horses belonging to the same category will be called back to the ring together for another round of the ring. The horses will then be allowed to return to the boxes and come back for the actual inspection. The purpose of pre-inspection is to allow the horses to relax and become familiar with the environment and allow the judges to observe their natural gaits.

3.7 Actual Inspection

The same inspection process is used for all categories:

- 1) Runner (or owner) dressed in white takes the horse to the centre of the ring, in front of the jury, where he stops for the evaluation of the general conditions, breed characteristics, frame and quality of legs and feet.
- 2) at the sign of the jury, the runner walks the horse drawing a triangle, so that the jury can observe the horse from behind (to evaluate the movement of the hind legs), the side (to evaluate the reach and impulse of the walk) and front (returning to the centre of the field so that the jury can observe the movement of the front legs).
- 3) to a new sign of the jury, the runner trots the horse for two rounds. In some cases, at the end of the two rounds, the jury can request a further round.
- 4) at the end of the inspection, the runner takes the horse out of the ring and returns it to the owner, who will then have to wait just outside the entrance until the end of the evaluation of all the horses belonging to the same group.
- 5) at the end of each category, all the horses called by the jury will return to the ring, led by their owner, to allow the jury to draw their conclusion on the full group of horses.
- 6) at the end of the inspection, the jury asks to lead the horses to the centre, to award the prize.
- 7) once all categories have been completed, the jury will award some special prizes such as: Best Foal, Best Stallion, Best Mare and Best in Show (best horse of the day). It is therefore compulsory to wait until the end of the day/event. Leaving before will result in losing the prize, that will be assigned to another horse.

THE JURY EVALUATION IS UNQUESTIONABLE

3.8 Evaluation sheet and prizes

The prizes are the awarded according to the score (from 0 to 10) obtained for the 5 different aspects assessed: breed characteristics, frame, legs and feet, walk and trot. The jury writes its evaluation on an evaluation sheet (Linear Score) and assigns prizes based on the average score obtained. It is not a ranking and therefore more than one first,

second or third prize can be awarded. The jury can admit the subject to the adult horse register (Stamboek vs veulenboek) even without assigning a prize.

Prizes awarded based on the average score are:

- ✓ 1st prize Ster: minimum average 7.5 minimum average gaits 6.5
- ✓ 2nd prize Ster: minimum average 7.0 / minimum average gaits 6.5
- ✓ 3rd prize Stamboek: minimum average 6.5, no minimum for gaits
- ✓ Stamboek without prize: lower average 6.0
- ✓ No prize (the horse is not registered in the adult horse register, stamboek, and remains in the foal register, Veulenboek)

In the event of an insufficient score for gaits (less than 6), the jury can reserve the right to award a lower prize than the one corresponding to the mathematical average. The first and second prize correspond to the Ster title and are assigned only to mares and geldings from 3 years up. Stallions from 3 years can compete exclusively for the 1st prize Ster and will remain in the foal book (Veulenboek), as only approved KFPS breeding stallions are admitted to the adult book (Stamboek). From 2017 also stallions younger than 3 can be inspected and receive a prize and ribbon, while until 2016 they could only receive from the jury an opinion without prize.

Some prizes are linked to minimum requirements:

Mares: minimum height for registration as Stamboek: 1.54

minimum height for Ster title: 1.56 minimum height for Kroon title 1.58 minimum height for Model title 1.60

Geldings: minimum height for registration in gelding adult book (Ruinenboek): 1.56

minimum height for Ster title: 1.58 **Stallions:** minimum height for Ster title: 1.58

3.9 Submission and return of pedigree

In compliance with EU regulation 262/2015/EC and Directive 90/426/EEC and 90/427/EEC on horse identification, the horse property must match in the Italian Ministry equine data base and corresponding Friesian Horse studbook.

Participation to the inspection day implies that the pedigree of the horse is submitted to the jury to be updated with any prize obtained and returned, together with the evaluation sheet (Linear Score), upon settlement of the relevant fees and invoice. The AFHI (for Italian citizens) or the KFPS (for foreign countries where there is no KFPS branch studbook), will send said invoice to the horse owner. The Linear Score is issued in full form only at first inspection day. In the case of participation to several inspections, only a simplified linear score will be issued (with only the final score for the 5 macro-categories). The simplified version is also released for foals, which will then obtain the complete linear score at the first inspection as adult horse. Updated pedigree and evaluation sheet will be sent to the owners only and exclusively upon payment of the corresponding invoice, issued following the inspection day. Payment of the KFPS membership fee is mandatory for the return of the updated pedigree. Above mentioned membership fee will be included in the invoice, where necessary (if not previously paid). Registration in the Stamboek and other KFPS book (Ster, Kroon, Model, etc.) have additional costs, that will be specified in the invoice.

Breeders/traders, who wish to participate in the Inspection day but not to register the horse/s on their name immediately, can request that the documents remain pending until the data of the new owner/buyer is confirmed (by filling in the horse sales form). It is understood that the documents will be returned and updated only upon

settlement of property transfer fees and other costs. Document updating fees, including the results/scores awarded at the inspection will be borne by the new buyer, unless otherwise agreed between the parties.

After 6 months, an invoice will be addressed to the breeder/trader for property transfer on his/her name.

3.10 Difficult horses

The jury reserves the right to decide not to inspect the horses that are difficult to manage. These horses will be given a second chance during the day, in one of the other categories. The possible exclusion from inspection does not determine any right to reimbursement of the participation fees or other costs. The jury decision is final and unquestionable.

Article 4. Jury

The jury is made of 2 judges appointed by the KFPS and expressly sent by the same from The Netherlands, upon request of the AFHI for the Italian Inspection Day. The jury will abide by the regulations and assessment standards established and already in use for the same type of inspections, regularly held in The Netherlands and around the world. The decision of the jury is final and unquestionable.

Article 5. Horse categories

5.1 Foals

Foals are split and inspected in different groups, based on gender and age. Foals of less than 1 year must be presented with the mother and can receive a 1st, 2nd or 3rd prize.

From 2017, fillies and colts of 1 and 2 years of age are presented in separate categories, receive prizes and ribbon, but no linear score.

5.2 Adult Horse (from 3 years up)

Horses are split and inspected in different groups by gender (geldings, mare, stallions) and age. They can receive a 1st, 2nd or 3rd price. Mares and geldings can be admitted to the adult horse book (Stamboek for mares and Ruinenboek, for geldings), even without a prize.

5.2.1 Mares

They can be admitted to the adult horse book (Stamboek) with 1st and 2nd prize (both corresponding to Ster title), 3rd prize or no prize. Jury can assign to 1st price Ster mare the title of PROVISIONAL Kroon/Model title, that can be validated and become final according to the rules described below.

5.2.1.1 Kroon Title

The Kroon title is assigned to mares for specific individual features and sport predisposition.

Outside The Netherlands, the jury can award the PROVISIONAL Kroon title during the local Inspection Day, organized by the local KFPS branch, to the mares that receive a 1st prize Ster prize and the jury a PROVISIONAL Kroon title, so not automatically only with the 1st prize Ster.

The minimum requirements for the Kroon title are:

- minimum age of three years
- minimum height at the withers: 1.58m
- 1st prize Ster + PROVISIONAL Kroon title and invitation of the jury to present the mare for the FINAL Kroon title

The FINAL Kroon title can be awarded on the same day as the AFHI local inspection:

- if the mare already has a Sport title

- if the mare completed in the past, or on the same date of AFHI inspection, the IBOP or ABFP test with a minimum score of 77.0 and an average of 7 for walk and trot. The title will not be awarded in case of a score lower than 6 for one of the gaits.

In the absence of the above requirements, the mare can take the IBOP/ABFP tests or apply for the Sport title within the same year and be presented to the Centraalkeuring in The Netherlands, in September, to get the FINAL Kroon title. If not presented, shit will have to take part to in a new local inspection the following year, receive again a 1st prize Ster and PROVISIONAL Kroon title and meet the requirements specified above (Sport or IBOP/ABFP) within the same year.

5.2.1.2 Model title

The Model is assigned to mares with already at least one foal for specific individual features and sport predisposition. In most cases, the transition from Ster to Model occurs through the Kroon title, but this is not the only way. Outside The Netherlands, the jury can assign the PROVISIONAL Model title during the AFHI inspection day, to the mares that receive a 1st prize Ster prize, so not automatically only with the 1st prize ster.

The minimum requirements for the Model title are:

- minimum age of seven years
- at least one foal in the past or one recently born
- minimum height at the withers: 1.60m
- 1st prize Ster + PROVISIONAL Model title and invitation of the jury to present the mare for the assignment of the FINAL Model title

The FINAL Model title can be issued at the AFHI inspection:

- if the mare already has the Sport title
- if the mare completed in the past, or the same date of AFHI inspection, the IBOP or ABFP test with a minimum score of 77.0 and an average of 7 for the walk and trot. The title will not be awarded in case of a score lower than 6 for one of the gaits.

In the absence of the above requirements, the mare can take the IBOP/ABFP tests or apply for the Sport title within the same year and be presented to the Centraalkeuring in The Netherlands, in September, to get the FINAL Model title. If not presented, shit will have to take part to in a new local inspection the following year, receive again a 1st prize Ster and PROVISIONAL Model title and meet the requirements specified above (Sport or IBOP/ABFP) within the same year.

5.2.2 Geldings

Geldings can be admitted to the gelding adult book (Ruinenboek) with the same prizes awarded to mares: 1st and 2nd prize Ster, 3rd prize or no prize.

5.2.3 Stallions (until 2016 stallions could be inspected only when they were 3, from 2017 also at 1 and 2 years-old) At standard inspection days, the evaluation of stallion only includes the award of the Ster title (corresponding to the 1st prize, not the second) or no prize. In both case, stallions will remain in the foal book (veulenboek). 1st prize Ster stallions can take part in the inspection and sport/health tests to become KFPS approved stallions (registered in the adult horse book, Stamboek), that currently take place only in The Netherlands (for more information contact AFHI). From 2017, also stallions below 3 years can be inspected and receive prizes and ribbon, while until 2016 they could only receive an opinion form the jury, without a prize. Stallion of 1 and 2 years of age can also receive prize and ribbon, but no linear score.



5.3 New rules for Inspection days introduced in 2018

Following the analysis of the results of the 2017 inspection days, the KFPS introduced some changes in the evaluation.

5.3.1 Short evaluation sheet for mares and geldings

Introduced in 2017 for mares and geldings registered in the veulenbook book and presented to be admitted to the stambook and for Ster mares and gelding.

5.3.2 New evaluation sheet for foals

The word "development" is replaced by "use of the legs", as the use of legs is a fundamental indication of the horse endurance/durability. Previously, this entry was however taken into consideration in the assessment of conformation, but the KFPS believes that it deserves a more in-depth assessment, in order to be able to bring the inspection of foals closer to that of adult horses and gather comparative information. Development and length of legs is included in conformation/frame evaluation. Given that the inspection is carried out while the foal is growing, the jury will mainly focus on the correctness of both front and hind legs and the quality of the legs.

The premium is determined by the total of points of the 5 characteristics whereby movement counts twice. Total of points = racial type + frame + legwork + 2x walk + 2x trot

5.3.2.1 Double points for gaits

As for adult horses, foal gaits (walk and trot) are multiplied by 2 while scores assigned for all external aspects (breed characteristics, frame, use of the legs) are not. In the past the minimum average for walk and trot was used to award prizes, now the total score is used (total score for all 5 characteristics, walk and trot by 2).

1st prize: breed characteristics + frame + use of legs + 2x walk + 2x trot ≥ 50 points

2nd prize: breed characteristics + frame + use of legs + 2x walk + 2x trot ≥ 46 and <50 points

3rd prize: breed characteristics + frame + use of legs + 2x walk + 2x trot ≥ 40 and <46 points

No prize: breed characteristics + frame + use of legs + 2x walk + 2x trot <40 points or in the case of more insufficient scores (4 or 5) for one of the 5 characteristics considered.

5.3.3 Walk assessment for foals

Given the difficulty of establishing a true correlation between the walk of foals and their walk as adult (3 years), the KFPS decided to implement the assessment of the in-hand walk for foals. The runner leads both the foal and its mare by lead rope for the rounds of walk. For the trot, the foal will be left free. It is therefore recommended to train the foal at home, so that it can learn to follow you walking, without stopping or running away.

5.3.4 More attention to hind leg conformation

From the analysis of the results of 2017 inspection days, a greater occurrence of hind legs defects was detected. The item "back position" in the linear score is the only one used to record this negative trend. Incorrect hocks are not desirable, as they reduce the power of the hind legs and cause a greater and premature wear of the joints. The KFPS has therefore decided to apply more restrictive criteria for the latter and to incorporate them into the general assessment with an impact also on the breeding value of the stallion (defect transmission).

5.4 Special prizes

At the end of the inspection day, the jury awards some special prizes (Best foal, Best stallion, Best mare and Best in Show, that is the best horse of the day). It is therefore recommended not to leave before the end of the event. Failure to do so will result in loss of the prize, that will be assigned to a different horse.

Article 6. Cancellation of the event and reimbursement of registration fees

If the event does not take place, for the failure to reach the minimum number of 20 horses, the entire registration amount will be reimbursed by bank transfer. In case of withdrawal/no-show or non-participation, the fee will be returned only and exclusively in the event of death of the horse, duly documented.

All payments will be transferred, specifying "Reimbursement for Friesian Horse Inspection & IBOP Test, owner name and surname, horse name". Registration fees <u>will not be reimbursed</u> in the event of withdrawal/no-show, but only and exclusively in the event of death of the horse, duly documented.

Horse for which the required payments/documentation have not been settled/submitted will not be entitled to any reimbursement.

Article 7. Application form and registration fees

The registration fee is calculated every year based on the organization expenses divided among participants. The runner service for the presentation of the horse is optional but recommended. The fee, established by the runners themselves, is to be paid in the morning of the event to AFHI and is usually around 25/30 euros per horse.

- ✓ copy of horse pedigree + copy of the first page of the horse passport
- ✓ copy of owner ID
- ✓ application form, duly filled in, signed and dated (see end of the present document)
- ✓ Microchip no. check: through veterinary statement on doctor's stationary, confirming the microchip read by means of suitable microchip reader OR declaration of the owner that the horse microchip no. was checked and confirmed as the same specified on the horse passport and pedigree
- ✓ Copy of Coggin's test anti-flu vaccination;
- ✓ Copy of owner's insurance (liability for damaged to third parties);
- ✓ Copy of payment of the registration fee for each horse
- ✓ Copy of payment of the membership fee (AFHI and KPFS), if not already paid

In the event of withdrawal or non-participation, the fee will be returned only and exclusively in the event of death of the horse, duly documented.

Article 8. Ibop test

Participation in the Ibop test is optional and not directly connected to the inspection day. The IBOP test can be organized on the Italian territory only by AFHI with KFPS jury. The objective of the test is to assess the horse's predisposition for various sport disciplines and issue a judgment as objective as possible. The test is designed for horses aged from 4 years, both for saddle and harness. It is not possible to participate with the same horse in the IBOP test more than twice within the same calendar year. The same horse can participate in two IBOP tests on the same day, but only on condition that they are two different disciplines (dressage and harness). The results of the IBOP test can be used to obtain the FINAL Kroon/Model title (see 5.2.1). The IBOP ring is selected by the AFHI in collaboration with the KFPS and can indoor or outdoor.

8.1 Ibop Test jury

The jury is composed of two KFPS judges qualified for the assessment of the IBOP test, selected by KFPS and sent from The Netherlands. Upon AFHI request.

Article 9. IBOP test requirements and application form

The event is open to all Frisian horses, registered in Italy and abroad, with a regular KFPS document/pedigree:

- yellow/green (before 2015) or white/light blue (from 2015), attesting registration in the main studbook
- pink or blue (before 2015) or white/black (after 2015), attesting the registration in the BIJBOEK I and BIJBOEK II subsidiary studbooks
- in case of absence/loss of the KFPS documents, any Frisians horse can still be admitted to the inspection, following microchip check. Contact with the AFHI must be established before the event, in order to request microchip check in the KFPS data base. If present, a duplicate correct passport and pedigree will be issued after the event, upon payment of relevant fees and invoice

12.1 Exclusion of the horse from the test

The horse can be excluded from the test if the jury detects critical elements (for example diseases or lameness). The jury may also decide to interrupt the test if it considers that the horse is not presented or mounted in an acceptable manner. Horses that do not comply with vaccinations obligations will not excluded from the test. In case of exclusion, no reimbursement is applicable.

12.2 Vaccinations

The horse must comply with all mandatory vaccinations. The vaccination certificate will be considered valid only if it can be demonstrated that it belongs to the horse registered for the IBOP test and if it certifies that the horse has been vaccinated for:

- a) The basic vaccination consisting of a first dose and a second after a minimum of 3 and a maximum of 6 weeks
- b) annual vaccination made no later than 12 months from the previous one.

The last vaccination must be performed at least one week before the IBOP.

Confirmation of vaccination must be authenticated by a veterinary surgeon signature and stamp.

12.3 IBOP test results

At the end of the test, the jury will give the rider the evaluation sheet, with the results, a brief explanation or any other information deemed necessary by the judges. The evaluation sheet will be signed with the date and signature by the jury president. The results will be published on the KFPS website and in the Dutch language magazine Phryso.
